Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Hello Rockville Art League members,

Hopefully we are all thinking about the RAL Spring Art Show. Lisa Sieg is once again coordinating the show and has been working on some of the preliminary steps. There are many things to consider and getting a head start will smooth the process later. She has gathered feedback from several members and has attached a calendar and notes later in the newsletter.

Please save the following dates on your calendar...May 17 for work delivery, May 17 through May 19 for show set up, May 21 for our opening reception, May 25 for the walk through with our judge and June 29 for final work pick up. We always have strong RAL volunteer participation and will need volunteers on all of these dates.

For this spring's show we are fortunate to have Maud Taber-Thomas helping us as the judge. She is an extremely talented artist and is currently represented by the Susan Calloway Fine Arts Gallery in Georgetown. She teaches classes at the National Gallery of Art and at the Yellow Barn Studio in Glen Echo. While she

grew up in the D.C. area, her studies have taken her to Maine, New York and Europe. I know you will all be glad to meet her and hear her comments on your work.

As artists we understand that learning is a life long journey. Sometimes I learn things in areas that are completely new to me. Put another way, sometimes I come to understand things in areas I never even knew I didn't know.

An example might help with the confusing line above. Prior to the last RAL meeting I had never even heard of Indian Kolam drawing. Shanti Chandra-Sekar, our March presenter, explained the Kolam tradition, demonstrated the technique and captivated the group. I am now a fan of an art form that I had absolutely no knowledge of a month ago.



I believe that when we are open to new things then we are often enriched. And we can learn something from every speaker and all of our fellow artists.

Our next speaker is a RAL member and a professional picture framer. You may remember Jae Shin's beautiful and often whimsical work from our member shows and in the next meeting we will hear about the art of framing. Her focus will be on the framing of work on paper and that will be most helpful for the watercolorists, drawers and photographers in the group. She will also give us some pointers on framing canvas work. Please come and learn on April 6.

In our last meeting we added a new element...a fun and gentle critique of a member's artwork. Here is how it works:

- A member brings a recently completed piece for view and discussion (and I was the test case and it really was fun...plus I received several really great suggestions).
- The piece is on display during the premeeting social time.
- At the start of our meeting, members can offer suggestions, critiques and comments. The comments are to be kind, constructive, sincere and concise (we only have a short time for this exercise).

We have time for the review of two or so pieces each time and please let me know if you would like to share a work in April's meeting. Please send me an email and we will take the volunteers in the order they are received.

Thank you all for being a part of RAL, for volunteering to help with our upcoming spring show and for being life-long learners.

RAL Juried Members' Spring Show Glenview Mansion

May 21 - June 28, 2017

Judge: Maud Taber-Thomas will be the judge for the spring Members' Art Show. She is an artist who specializes in oil paintings and charcoal drawings. Trained in classical techniques at the New York Academy of Art, and with a background in the liberal arts from Bowdoin College and Oxford University, Maud Taber-Thomas draws inspiration for her evocative portraits, interiors, and landscapes from the narratives and characters of classical literature. Her works, which range in scale from miniature to larger than life, capture the vibrant light and color of far-off places and time periods. She teaches drawing and painting classes at the National Gallery of Art and at the Yellow Barn Studio at Glen Echo. Her drawings and paintings have been shown at a number of galleries in the Washington, DC area and New York. Her work is represented by Susan Calloway Fine Arts, in Washington DC. Her website is: https://maudtaberthomas.com/. She will conduct a gallery walkthrough on Thursday, May 25, at 6.30 PM.

Eligibility and rules: RAL now includes a category for photography in the art show. The following rules apply for all works entered. Each member in good standing may enter two works. The maximum length of any framed side is 60 inches. Only **original** works securely framed with hanging wire are acceptable. The entries must have been completed within the last two years and may not have been exhibited previously in a RAL Member Show. No reproductions, no giclées and no wet canvases are allowed. A work having multiple framed parts must meet the two works per member criteria. Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted. RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show. The artist's signature on the Show Agreement also constitutes a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price to the City of Rockville for works sold during the show.

If your number is listed, then you or your designee must pick up your work on Thursday May 18, 5:00 -6:30 PM or Friday, May 19, 11:30 AM -1:00 PM.

Gallery Walk Through: Thursday, May 25, at 6:30PM. (Note: this in in place of the May meeting.)

Reception: Sunday, May 21, from 1:30-3:30 PM. Presentation of awards at 2 PM. Light refreshments.

Final Pick Up: Thursday, June 29, 11:30 AM – 1 PM and 5:00-6.30 PM. Your work must be picked up. Please have your designee pick up your work if necessary. Any work left after Thursday 6:30 PM will not be insured. There is no storage available. Sales: The Glenview Mansion staff will manage art sales. The artist's signature on the Show Agreement also constitutes a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price to the City of Rockville for works sold during the show.



Critique by Penny Kritt

Artistic Paper

The surface you choose for your artwork can radically change the appearance of the composition. If you aren't already an educated consumer, the information below will save you both money and frustration.

One big advantage of paper is that it's an inexpensive support, regardless of whether you are drawing, painting or creating a collage. It's also easy to crop an image if the need arises.

If you haven't learned about paper qualities by now, doing so may explain why you're not getting what you expected. Be sure to always buy artist quality paper, not student grade. There is a small difference in price, but the performance difference can be huge. Here are the most important standards and why they matter.

Paper color: Unless you are looking at papers displayed together on an open rack, it's hard to imagine how different "white" papers are from one to another, even from the same manufacturer. There can be a huge difference, especially if you just leave the paper unpainted instead of using

opaque white paint for the lightest areas. This is a critical element to get the value contrasts you might require. You won't get the same dramatic image on a traditional paper. Artist-quality papers will tell you where the product ranks.





In the sample above, there is a considerable difference in the contrast between the "white of the eye" and the highlight as compared to the iris and pupil. For the most accurate colors, the whiter the paper, the better.

Paper texture: Especially when you buy a block or a pad of paper, the label usually tells you about its texture. "Hot press", also known as "Not", has a very smooth surface. It gives the artist the most control over the shapes he makes. The other end of the spectrum is called "Rough" and it is significantly pitted. This makes for puddles of paint in multiple, unanticipated areas, good for creating texture or abstracts. It's also known as "tooth" that pastels can use as a foothold to stay on the surface instead of just falling off a slicker finish. "Cold press" is in the middle and often is chosen as the best of both worlds.

Paper sizing: If a paper is sized, it has a product either within the paper fibers or sealed on the surface that inhibits or prevents liquids from sinking into the paper. The advantage to this is that it makes it easy to lift off offending products without harming or abrading the paper's finish.

Working on paper presents unique challenges that vary by media. For painters, these fall under the heading of what happens when the paper comes in contact with any source of liquid. Even with a thick paper, working with really wet, juicy watercolors may cause the paper to buckle. That buckling leaves valleys where paint can puddle and leave a darker area instead of a smooth passage of color. Vigorous lifting color and/or reworking areas can also damage the paper's surface irreparably.

Even if you use archival quality paper, you still have long term issues with paints and any other materials – including those used in framing – that come into contact with the paper. Any chemicals in these products can eventually cause deterioration or discoloring. Light sources can also cause fading, especially since few watercolorists seal their art with a protective coating.

The good points are lessened, however, by other characteristics of paper. First and foremost, while paper is a relatively cheap support for your work, the cost of framing is usually much higher than the frame required for a comparably sized canvas.

The cost of a finished, framed paper-backed artwork will usually be higher than with other media. This is because it will always require a frame and/or other support if you want to hang it. Protective glass is usually necessary to protect it from fading and humidity. The glass begets the need for a mat to keep the paper from touching the glass and to allow materials to breathe. Now that inexpensive paper is dwarfed by the cost of the frame. And it gets even more expensive if you have to ship the piece. If the work is accepted into a show, the rules may require framing with Plexiglas to avoid damage from broken glass. But Plexiglas is fairly expensive and it scratches easily.

It's a lot easier to crop artwork on paper than on canvas. There is a huge offsetting factor, however, because cropping almost invariably leaves you with a size that won't fit standard frame sizes.

I have a chart like the one below so I can plan the size of my work and reduce the chance of needing custom framing. I keep this chart – and a six-inch ruler! – in my art kit.

11x14"	7.5x9.5"	Fits 8x10" Picture
12x16"	8.5x11"	1.75" Border

An inexpensive workaround is to get a larger standard size frame and just have a professionally cut mat to fit within it. The custom mat will be more costly than a standard size one, but the real savings comes from purchasing a standard size frame.





The receptions at Glenview mansion are 1:30-3:30 PM on the Sunday after hanging. Preferred drop off and pick up times for Glenview Shows are from 9 am to 12 noon. Drop off/pickups are Mondays (unless a holiday). If you are unavailable on the date for pickup, please arrange for someone to pick up for you. There is no room to store your artwork at the Mansion. If you are unable to drop off/pick up on the assigned dates and you can't find someone else to drop off/pick up for you, please choose a month in which you can make those dates.

For artwork delivery, please unwrap your work and take the wrappings with you. Please bring pliers (needle nose are easy to work with). You may use the hand truck that is at the Mansion to move your artwork from your vehicle. There is no staff at the mansion available to help you move your artwork into the conference rooms. You are responsible for hanging your own artwork, with help from the Mansion staff. If you don't have labels for your work, please fill out the RAL cards that will be available. If you print your own, print them on card stock.
