

Nature lovers, please mark your calendars for this beautiful show!

RAL Members *in good standing* are eligible to submit original work for this show which means you must **renew** your membership for 2019-2020.

<u>Call for entries:</u> you will be asked to submit work online only. A JotForm is available now **until September 27:**

Please read through all information below before submitting and be sure to type your information in carefully. The information you provide will be used to contact you and print the labels.

You will be informed by Friday, October 4 if your work was accepted into this show. Theme: Nature! Submit your wonderful landscapes, seascapes, vegetation, flowers,

floral arrangements, botanicals, etc., for this exhibition.

Eligibility and Rules: Each member may enter one framed piece by submitting an online JotForm. The form will ask for your name, title of piece, medium, price, dimensions, contact info, and an image of the piece you are submitting. If possible, please rename your image (jpg or jpeg accepted) with the title of the work you are submitting, prior to uploading it. Please type in your information carefully. If you typed in your email correctly, you will receive an automated confirmation.

- The maximum measurement of any framed side is **36 inches**.
- Only original works <u>framed securely</u> <u>with hanging wire</u> are acceptable. NO sawtooth hangers, etc. ~ must be securely wired.
- If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished appropriately.
- NO wet canvases allowed.
- All artists should clearly mark their name and title on the reverse of their piece.
- Any work not meeting these basic requirements will not be hung.
- RAL retains the right to determine the suitability of the work for entry in this show.

Original works (2-D only) include:

- Oils and acrylics
- Watercolors
- Pastels, drawings, hand-pulled prints
- Mixed Media, collage, experimental and original computer-generated art
- Photography
- Bin Work (see details below)

<u>Bin work:</u> will also be accepted and if submitting, you will need to submit a JotForm for each piece. Under "medium"

please type in the word **BIN.** Unframed giclée prints (yes! they're accepted as bin work) or original artwork no larger than 16 x 20 inches will be accepted for the bin work. *All bin work MUST have a backing* and *be enclosed in a clear plastic bag.* (Brookside gardens will allow the RAL a maximum of 30 pieces for our entire group.

Sales: All sales will be handled by the Brookside Gardens Gift Shop. Brookside Gardens will collect and pay to the State of MD a 6% sales tax on all sales. Shortly after the end of the exhibit, Brookside Gardens will send the artist a check for any artwork sold during the exhibit less a 25% commission.

<u>Commissions:</u> artists will be asked to sign a show agreement that Brookside Gardens will receive a 25% commission on any sales made during the exhibit or for a 6-month period after the exhibit.

Members will be asked to bring *the show agreement* as well as a \$5 *show fee* at drop off.

Delivery and registration: Monday, October 14. Hours 9:30 – 11:00 am **Pick-up:** Monday, Nov. 11, 9:00 am and possibly Sunday, Nov. 10 (3-5pm). The pick-up hours will be confirmed at the end of Sept.

We will need volunteers to help at check-in and help hang and label the work.

Critique by Penny Kritt

Creating Gifts for the Holidays

By September, many of us are already planning for the upcoming holidays and all the art projects and gifts that we'll need. By October, there are craft projects for the kids as they prepare for Halloween. November brings Thanksgiving and new tableware and linens if you're the cook or a hostess gift if you're not. Then December brings Christmas, Chanukah, Kwanza and maybe a new outfit to wear on New Year's Eve.

Life gets even more interesting if you're a working artist who creates products for sales online and at holiday gift bazaars. So much to do: create a budget for inventory, then be sure it will arrive in time, store it somewhere, find a way to pack and carry it where it needs to be – without any breakage. Don't forget to bring tables and display racks so buyers can see your products. It's almost overwhelming, isn't it?

Let's break things down into manageable segments, and I'll give you some tools to make the whole process easier and much less stressful. You probably fall into one of three categories.

- 1. Crafter or parent who wants the kids to learn the joy of creating gifts for others.
- 2. You've got some artwork that's good enough to use for gifts. Yay!
- 3. You're a working artist who needs inventive ways to create and sell products.

Here are a few options to make the process both fun and easier than you might have imagined.

For a simple project that's fun to do with kids, stores like Michaels will have lots to decorate, even if your budget is small. Or look online for age-appropriate projects.

A site like

https://www.pinterest.com/square1art/handprintart/ is great for little ones. For older kids, go to a site like https://www.weareteachers.com/easy-

<u>christmas-crafts-for-kids/</u> and you can throw in a subtle lesson about recycling!

If you're in the middle category where you've finally admitted your artwork is pretty good, you can avoid the peril of giving the unwanted gift! Maybe you painted a large portrait of the dog your in-laws treat like a grandkid, but giving it to them could cause some strife. What if they don't hang it – will you be insulted? Or if they do, are they just being nice?

Take the middle ground! There are many companies that will use a digital image that you upload and print it on a variety of products. Give them a set of mugs with the painted dog image on it. You can use a digital image that you took on your cell phone of a great sunset to be printed on tee shirts. Another gift is putting your artwork on a cell phone cover! Just google companies that print gifts.

These kinds of gifts are usually inexpensive and arrive quickly. Below are a large candle and a phone cover I offer.



First, check for reviews of each company. Once you choose a few, you can compare prices and quality of the items presented. Be sure to check the delivery schedule!

For the artist who sells – or wants to investigate how to do it – the stakes are higher. If you're going to sell something, make it something that actually earns you a lot of money. Not just money, a lot of it, because your costs will be

higher than you think. It's not just the time and expense of creating things to sell. Will you also pay for a website and its maintenance? What about show fees?

Will you only sell your original art and prints of it? What about using those images to create other products like clothing, scarves and purses? Or maybe housewares like napkins, towels and glassware?

Will you have to buy large quantities to get affordable pricing and where will you store them? Are the products cheaply made or of materials that you will be proud to sell and worth a higher price? It's nice to sell 150 products, but if you only earn \$2 on each one, is it really worth the effort?

Choose your manufacturers/vendor(s) for how they support artists. Select one that collaborates with designers on standards of quality, sustainability and financial responsibility. Will the company do anything to help you promote sales of your artwork? Are there monthly fees or other up-front costs for set up? Who owns rights to your artwork? Perhaps you want products only made in America or one that that is proud of a global network that creates jobs in environmentally friendly way.

I chose Vida (www.shopvida.com) because I wanted to create art that didn't have to be framed. My first products were scarves and my first order of 10 of them sold within hours. What a surprise! Eventually I designed – and sold – clothing and other products as well.



Get lots of unique products out of one great image. One of my first original designs is shown above on a scarf that is 28x80 inches! That's about twice the size of an average scarf so it even works well for plus size customers. A small portion of the image is shown on the leather clutch bag to the right. Below, the studio tote bag has a repeated pattern (done with free software on the Vida site). At the bottom left, I photoshopped a fuchsia background in and created home goods including tea towels. And it was all done within 10 minutes.

Vida will give you free page to display your collection. Create as many products as you want. Use social media to drive customers there. You can price products as high or low as you want (above the manufacturing costs, of course). You'll earn a commission on whatever sells. There's nothing you buy or have to ship, it's all done for you. Or just use your current sales channels and only use Vida as your manufacturer. All of this is free. For a fee, Vida also offers professional photos of your products and advertising on social media if you want to reach a larger audience.

If you do shows, fabric goods are much lighter to carry and they don't break if you drop them! You'll only pay about \$60 (or less if you buy in quantities) for that big cashmere and silk scarf. Maybe you will sell one to your best friend for a little profit, but Saks sells scarves this size for over \$400. Charge whatever you think appropriate!

If you sell on Etsy, think how all these new products will drive traffic to your site. With so many more designs, you rank higher with search engines. Want to conserve cash? Tell your buyers that they will wait for their *products to be custom made for them*, so you have no inventory costs. *You don't buy until the customer has paid you.* If one item turns out to be a big hit, then stock it and offer immediate delivery.

I started with Vida two ago and I put a lot of work into creating and selling products. I am both proud and astonished to say that I have become a top seller for them. If you're interested in learning more about retailing (or wholesaling) your products, call me to learn more. If you're great at using social media, call me because I need help there. Full disclosure, if you become a Vida designer, I'll earn a small commission.




MEMBER NEWS

GLENVIEW MANSION CONFERENCE ROOM SHOWS

You can show your artwork in Glenview Mansion for one month if you have received a 1st, 2nd, 3rd or honorable mention award in an RAL juried show. Artists may have both rooms to exhibit in if a second artist doesn't sign up for the same month within two months of the show's start date. The receptions at Glenview mansion are 1:30-3:30 PM on the Sunday after hanging. Preferred drop off and pick up times for Glenview Shows are from 9 am to 12 noon. Drop off/pickups are Mondays (unless a holiday). If you are unavailable on the date for pickup, please arrange for someone to pick up for you. There is no room to store your artwork at the Mansion. If you are unable to drop off/pick up on the assigned dates and you can't find someone else to drop off/pick up for you, please choose a month in which you can make those dates.

For artwork delivery, please unwrap your work and take the wrappings with you. Please bring pliers (needle nose are easy to work with). You may use the hand truck that is at the Mansion to move your artwork from your vehicle. There is no staff at the mansion available to help you move your artwork into the conference rooms. You are responsible for hanging your own artwork, with help from the Mansion staff. If you don't have labels for your work, please fill out the RAL cards that will be available. If you print your own, print them on card stock. Do not use the sticky Avery labels, unless you adhere them to foam core or card stock.
