Rockville Art League 2019-2020 Speaker Series

October 3rd, 2019 **Jean Hirons: Pastel Painting**Planning to do a fall landscape with emphasis on color



Jean Hirons has been painting exclusively in pastel since 1994 and in 2003, she retired from the Library of Congress to pursue pastel full time. She began teaching in 2005 at Montgomery College and realized that she loves teaching as much as painting. She now teaches classes in her large studio at Artists and Makers Studios in Rockville.

Jean is a former member of the Waverly Street Gallery and has shown her work for years in solo and group shows. She has an upcoming show at the Fisher Gallery at Northern Virginia Community College and next year will exhibit her city paintings at the Women's National Democratic Club.

She is a signature member of the Pastel Society of America and a Master Circle member of the International Association of Pastel Societies. Her book, *Finding Your Style in Pastel*, was published in 2012 to great acclaim. More recently, Jean has been serving as a juror of shows.

Jean loves to share her enthusiasm for pastel with others. She has given two previous demos for the Rockville Art League, as well as for other area art leagues. In her demonstration for RAL, Jean will discuss the challenges of painting brilliant fall foliage and her method for taming chroma in paintings with the use of an underpainting.

Nature lovers, please mark your calendars for this beautiful show!
RAL Members *in good standing* are eligible to submit original work for this show which

means you must **renew** your membership for 2019-2020.

Call for entries: you will be asked to submit work online only. A JotForm is available now until September 27: https://form.jotform.com/92175180512149
Please read through all information below before submitting and be sure to type your information in carefully. The information you provide will be used to contact you and print the labels.

You will be informed by Friday, October 4 if your work was accepted into this show. Theme: Nature! Submit your wonderful landscapes, seascapes, vegetation, flowers, floral arrangements, botanicals, etc., for this exhibition.

Eligibility and Rules: Each member may enter one framed piece by submitting an online JotForm. The form will ask for your name, title of piece, medium, price, dimensions, contact info, and an image of the piece you are submitting. If possible, please rename your image (jpg or jpeg accepted) with the title of the work you are submitting, prior to uploading it. Please type in your information carefully. If you typed in your email correctly, you will receive an automated confirmation.

- The maximum measurement of any framed side is **36 inches**.
- Only original works <u>framed securely</u> <u>with hanging wire</u> are acceptable. NO sawtooth hangers, etc. ~ must be securely wired.
- If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished appropriately.
- NO wet canvases allowed.
- All artists should clearly mark their name and title on the reverse of their piece.
- Any work not meeting these basic requirements will not be hung.

 RAL retains the right to determine the suitability of the work for entry in this show.

Original works (2-D only) include:

- Oils and acrylics
- Watercolors
- Pastels, drawings, hand-pulled prints
- Mixed Media, collage, experimental and original computer-generated art
- Photography
- Bin Work (see details below)

Bin work: will also be accepted and if submitting, you will need to submit a JotForm for each piece. Under "medium" please type in the word **BIN.** Unframed giclée prints (yes! they're accepted as bin work) or original artwork no larger than 16 x 20 inches will be accepted for the bin work. All bin work MUST have a backing and be enclosed in a clear plastic bag. (Brookside gardens will allow the RAL a maximum of 30 pieces for our entire group.

Sales: All sales will be handled by the Brookside Gardens Gift Shop. Brookside Gardens will collect and pay to the State of MD a 6% sales tax on all sales. Shortly after the end of the exhibit, Brookside Gardens will send the artist a check for any artwork sold during the exhibit less a 25% commission.

<u>Commissions:</u> artists will be asked to sign a show agreement that Brookside Gardens will receive a 25% commission on any sales made during the exhibit or for a 6-month period after the exhibit.

Members will be asked to bring *the show* agreement as well as a \$5 show fee at drop off.

<u>Delivery and registration:</u> Monday, October 14. Hours 9:30 – 11:00 am **Pick-up:** Monday, Nov. 11, 9:00 am and possibly Sunday, Nov. 10 (3-5pm). The pick-up hours will be confirmed at the end of Sept.

We will need volunteers to help at check-in and help hang and label the work.

Call for entries: <u>deadline Thursday</u>, <u>November 7</u>. *Online registrations only*.

We are excited that the Rockville Art League Juried Member's Winter Show will be on exhibit at Glenview Mansion and honored to have Kris Loya as our judge.

Judge: Kris Loya has lived and worked in Loudoun County, Virginia, for the past decade working as operations and marketing director for a talent-acquisition firm and then as the manager of Tryst Gallery in Leesburg. Prior to moving to Virginia, Kris lived and worked in Trinidad and Tobago as a brand architect specializing in web and graphic design and later incorporating social media management.

As an artist herself, Kris understands the need for artists to take charge of their careers and focus on creating a brand to effectively market themselves.

As the manager of Tryst Gallery, Kris focuses on building their roster of artists and

helps new artists to transition from creating to showing and promoting their work.

Kris Loya will conduct a gallery walk-though on **Thursday**, **December 12 at 6:30pm**.

Call Deadline: You will be asked to submit your work online only. *Members in good standing* may submit up to 2 pieces of work for this show beginning Tuesday, October 1 – Thursday, November 7. No submissions will be accepted after the November 7 deadline. If your work was accepted into this show, you will be informed by Friday, November 15. Please read all the information below carefully before submitting.

Entry Fee: A \$10 show fee will be collected when *accepted* artwork is dropped off along with the show agreement.

Eligibility and rules: The following rules apply for all works entered. Each member in good standing may enter up to two pieces. For each piece you will need to submit a separate online form. For each submission you will be required to submit an image of your piece on the online form. If possible, please name your image (jpg or jpeg) with your artwork's title, prior to uploading it. The maximum measurement of any framed side is 48 inches. Only original works framed securely with hanging wire are acceptable. (No sawtooth hangers or such.) If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished. No reproductions, no giclées, and no wet canvases are allowed. The entries may not have been exhibited previously in a RAL Member Show. All artists should clearly mark their name and title on the back of their piece. Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted. RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show. Artists will be required to sign a show agreement to be submitted with their

work at registration and also sign it out at the final pick up. (If your work is accepted into this show, you will receive the show agreement.) All work must remain up until the end of the show.

Sales: Requests for purchase by interested buyers will be forwarded to the artists by the Rockville Art League president or juried show coordinator. The artist's signature on the Show Agreement also constitutes a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price to the City of Rockville for works sold during the show.



Critique by Penny Kritt

Tinting with Rose, Teal and Burnt Orange

Do you have a *personal style*, something that makes your work recognizable and distinctly "you"? Are scenes of ocean waves crashing on the rocks something you love to create? Maybe you do pet portraits or still life creations that showcase antique toys. And does it really matter?

My compositions have few cohesive qualities. Bamboo is in a lot of my work, but there are lots of animals in others. With most subjects, I'm torn between a more minimal approach versus adding more details and realism. For me, nothing is easier to paint than abstracts because they always *scream* at me to stop when they are done. Everything else is a matter of personal preference.

But one common element in much of my work is creating complex colors. There's a pattern to what I do, and perhaps it will encourage you to find your own version. In this demo, the goal is to have a *painterly* composition. That means that the viewer will easily be able to identify objects, but the colors – and perhaps the brushstrokes – make it clear that it is a work created by an artist's hand, not just a photo.

Let's look at a before and after.



Before

Always decide where your center of interest will be before you start. It will give your composition balance. It makes a road map of what areas/shapes should be more prominent and where things should be minimized in importance.



After

The letters on the image above indicate what color wash I added. O is for orange, R for rose and T for teal. For shadows, I mixed rose and teal to get a lovely dusty purple marked as P. As you can see from the color swatches below, all of the washes were muted, not bright, saturated colors. Technically, there's still a lot of brown, but now it's a *variety* of browns.







Use a triad approach like the one above. As you probably know, color theory tries to pretend that all colors can be made from one or more of the three primary colors, yellow, red and blue. Here's why that's such a useful thing to consider. For the purpose of glazing or adding a wash (a mixture of paint with water or medium to make it semi-transparent), I've used the colors above as a modified primary triad. The orange box works as my yellow when compared to the other colors shown. The rose is my red and the teal acts as the blue.

Here's a different version of the triad system.







Ochre is our yellow (more blue, less red than the orange above). The brick red color has more blue and a lot of yellow. Just for something different, there is a royal purple as our blue and it has red instead of yellow.



The information above is the "how". Here's the "why".

Warm colors like yellow, or in this case a muddy orange, makes objects appear nearer to the viewer. Generally, yellow and orange even more so will wordlessly indicate a happier, sunnier or warmer environment.

Red is the most eye-catching color. Humans are programmed to see it as most important in any form relative to other colors. When you want to make a shape or area important, find an excuse to use a fair amount of red there. Using hard edges rather than softer, blended ones, will also help make it stand out more than other shapes. Save your brightest reds for the most important part of your work. While dayglo bright orange will demand the viewer's attention, it's usually too powerful to use by itself. But a burnt orange color always gives a nice warm glow.

For blue tints I prefer to use a manganese blue or a teal color. These are blues that each have some yellow and thus are a little green. French ultramarine, cobalt or indathrone blues all have some red in them and they appear "colder" than a blue with yellow.

Try this experiment on your own artwork. First, take a painting that you have given up on and maybe you'll get lucky! Or, if you have a photo editing program, just create layers where you

can add each the triad you choose. With light washes or glazes that follow the system described above, see what you get!

Life gets even more interesting if you're a working artist who creates products for sales online and at holiday gift bazaars. So much to do: create a budget for inventory, then be sure it will arrive in time, store it somewhere, find a way to pack and carry it where it needs to be – without any breakage. Don't forget to bring tables and display racks so buyers can see your products. It's almost overwhelming, isn't it?



The show runs from October 2 through November 30, 2019. Reception will be held at the church between services beginning at 10AM Sunday, November 10th.



GLENVIEW MANSION CONFERENCE ROOM SHOWS

You can show your artwork in Glenview Mansion for one month if you have received a 1st, 2nd, 3rd or honorable mention award in an RAL juried show. Artists may have both rooms to exhibit in if a second artist doesn't sign up for the same month within two months of the show's start date. The receptions at Glenview mansion are 1:30-3:30 PM on the Sunday after hanging. Preferred drop off and pick up times for Glenview Shows are from 9 am to 12 noon. Drop off/pickups are Mondays (unless a holiday). If you are unavailable on the date for pickup, please arrange for someone to pick up for you. There is no room to store your artwork at the Mansion. If you are unable to drop off/pick up on the assigned dates and you can't find someone else to drop off/pick up for you, please choose a month in which you can make those dates.

For artwork delivery, please unwrap your work and take the wrappings with you. Please bring pliers (needle nose are easy to work with). You may use the hand truck that is at the Mansion to move your artwork from your vehicle. There is no staff at the mansion available to help you move your artwork into the conference rooms. You are responsible for hanging your own artwork, with help from the Mansion staff. If you don't have labels for your work, please fill out the RAL cards that will be available. If you print your own, print them on card stock. Do not use the sticky Avery labels, unless you adhere them to foam core or card stock.
