Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Hello Rockville Art League Artists,

Spring has arrived, almost.

I am feeling hopeful about 2021. We are finding appointments, getting vaccinated and perhaps thinking about or even planning trips that have been put on hold for the last 12 months. There seems to be a sense of calm now and we missed that during most of 2020.

As we emerge from the distancing, I wonder how many of the changes we were encouraged (or required) to make in 2020 will prevail in the future.

Plus, we probably discovered things during the pandemic that we have enjoyed and hope will continue.

I look forward to meeting in person and exhibiting our work in the mansion gallery and I expect that our shows will have a continuing "virtual" component.

We have had a series of terrific Zoom and video presentations this past year and many were facilitated and enabled by technology. For example, in prior years I had asked last month's guest artist Christine Lashley to demonstrate to our league but as a Virginia

resident she was reluctant to brave the traffic to meet with us. Technology made her talk possible and what a fantastic presentation it was...one that I have viewed several times. It is easy to see why she wins so many prizes and has an international following. I believe that these presentations help us to become better artists.

As we strive to improve our craft, we could certainly use the artists and friends in our league to provide feedback on our work (I miss our "gentle critiques" a component of in-person meetings).

Artist and alumni board member Paula Zeller is spearheading an effort to organize critique groups within our membership. We are planning a special presentation by the owner of the Compass Atelier Glen Kessler to speak to us about effective critique techniques. His talk will be in June and it will jump start organizing member critique groups during the summer. More details to come in future newsletters.

The application we have chosen for entering and displaying our work, virtually, will certainly be used in the future. Our beautiful "For Love of Glenview" show that is online now (see more on this later in the newsletter) was the test for this

program and process. It passed with flying colors.

The show call for our 2021 Spring Juried Art Show is published and all members in good standing should have received their person entry link and password. (Please contact me if you wish to enter and did not receive your link.) We are off to a great start having already seen more than 40 submissions and the deadline is on April 19, a month away.

Below are some positive and affirming reasons that I enter juried shows...

- I work hard on my art practice and I feel validated when given the opportunity to display my work. I like seeing my work on display with the work of other accomplished artists
- Art is beautiful and beauty needs to be shared, now more than ever and always. Additionally, if my work has a story, then I want it to be told.
- I appreciate the challenge and discipline of getting ready for a show.
- I benefit from the association with other artists' lovely and compelling work.
- And I respect the opinions of judges and learn and from them. The overview of our shows with our judge are always a highlight of our year, whether they are virtual or, perhaps sometime this year (when safe), in person at the gallery.

Our judge for this spring's show is past presenter Dr. Renee Sandell and you may remember her talk on Hokusai's painting of "The Great Wave Off Kanagawa" and resilience last October. More on our spring show is later in the newsletter and please feel free to reach out to me or our juried show leader Lisa Sieg if you have any questions.

Speaking of show judges, last winter's judge was artist Katherine Nelson. Fortunately, she has agreed to speak with us via Zoom on April 1 about her art and her travels, and I can't wait.

Katherine Nelson: A Drawing Demo and Presentation, Thursday, April 1, 2021, 7pm on Zoom

We are delighted to welcome back Katherine Nelson who juried our Winter Show for a drawing demo and presentation on Zoom.



An artist, educator, juror, expat, traveler, and grain enthusiast, she earned her Bachelor of Science in Art Education K-12 from Skidmore College, NY in 1985 and a Master of Arts in Drawing from SUNY Albany in 1990. She has been an Instructor of Drawing at The Columbia Art Center and has taught art to all ages in the past 25 years in both public and private schools. Katherine Nelson has taught drawing at The Yellow Barn Studio and has written curriculum for museum art education workshops in drawing. Her drawings/sculpture have been included in over one hundred and twenty-five combined exhibits of solo, juried, and invitational shows in the USA and Europe. In this zoom presentation Katherine will discuss her work through her travel experience as an

expat, incorporating images, inspiration, and her life as an artist into the medium of charcoal as a means of expression. She will talk about techniques and materials throughout the demo. She welcomes you to have charcoal and paper, if you'd like to draw along trying some of the drawing methods. There will be time for questions.

With over 45 years of art teaching experience in classrooms and museums and other venues, Renee is founding director of the expeditionary, museum based SummerVision DC Program, which she designed and has delivered for the National Art Education Association (NAEA) since 2010. Previously Director/Professor of Art Education at George Mason University (2004-2014) and Professor of Art Education at Maryland Institute College of Art (1990-2003), in 1980, Sandell was a Fellow at the National Endowment for the Arts. Co-author of two books on gender issues (and a forthcoming book Real Lives 21: Stories Showcasing the Stories of Art Educators and Contemporary Learning), Sandell has published numerous articles, book chapters and art curricula. Dr. Sandell will announce the award-winning pieces on Sunday, May 16 at 2:00pm on **Zoom**. (A zoom link will be emailed out to members a few days prior.) The entire virtual show will be made available on our website and a recording of this zoom will be sent out to members afterwards.

We are using an app called Artwork Archive for all submissions to this show.

Please read through all information below carefully.

Call Deadline: *Members in good standing* may submit up to 2 pieces of work to be juried for this show now through **April 19.** No submissions will be accepted after the April 19 deadline. If your work is accepted into this show, you will be informed by May 3. Please read all the information below carefully before submitting.

Entry Fee: A \$10 show fee will be collected from accepted artists (not per piece).

Eligibility and rules: The following rules apply for all works entered. Each member in good standing may enter up to two pieces.

- Each member in good standing has been sent a unique entry link and a password. Please save the link and use it to submit your work for the RAL Juried Members' Spring Show. When you click the link sent to you, you will be prompted for your password. Please type it in exactly. It is case sensitive. No extra spaces. If you have not received your link, please contact Patrick Sieg president@rockvilleartleague.org
- For each submission you will be required to submit an image (jpeg or jpg.) of your piece on the online form. The mat or the frame (or glass, glare, wall, etc.) should NOT be visible in the image you submit. Just the artwork itself.
- Although this is planned as a virtual show, your piece should be ready for hanging, gallerywrapped or framed or professionally finished, securely wired.
- The maximum measurement of any framed side is 48 inches.
- The entries may not have been exhibited previously in a RAL Juried Members' Show.
- You may submit up to 2 pieces to be juried for this show. As always, let it be your best quality work and something that speaks to you and others.

- RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show.
- Work is to be submitted with the online submission link emailed to you. A submission of the form constitutes that you agree to the terms of the show agreement stated below.
- Sales: As the Spring Juried Member's Show is virtual, there will be no commission to the City of Rockville. Artists may handle their own sales and any inquiries sent to the Rockville Art League juried show coordinator or the president will be forwarded to the artist. (If there is a safe opportunity for an exhibition at Glenview Mansion, then instructions would be sent out to accepted artists. And in the event of an actual show, the *City of Rockville* handles the sales and a 20% commission of works sold would be donated to the *City of Rockville*.)

Categories of Artwork:

- Oils and acrylics
- Watercolors
- Pastels, drawings, and hand-pulled prints
- Mixed media, collage, experimental, and original computer-generated art
- Photographs
- Sculpture and ceramics

Awards:

- Best in Show (cash prize)
- First, Second, Third in all categories (<u>cash</u> <u>prizes</u>)
- Honorable Mention at Judge's Discretion
 Schedule:
- Online entry links were emailed to artists the first week of March.
- April 19 deadline for all submissions
- May 3 acceptances sent out by this date
- May 16 presentation of award-winning pieces on Zoom at 2:00pm. A zoom link will be sent out to members a few days in advance.

Online form: register your work *online* using the link and password that was sent to you. Detailed instructions below. Submissions of up

to 2 pieces per artist for consideration by the judge will be accepted by **Monday, April 19**. The *Show Agreement*: a submission of the form *constitutes that you agree* to the terms of the show agreement.

"I agree to the rules of the show as presented in the show call, that my entries are my original works and have not been accepted into a previous Rockville Art League Juried Members' Show, and I will not hold the Rockville Art League, Glenview Mansion or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries. As with any show, I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in the handling of entries. I give RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to use images of my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during a physical show at Glenview to the City of Rockville. If it remains virtual only, there will be no commission due."

Instructions for online form:

When you submit your work to be juried, please complete the following fields. Other fields are optional and will not be used in the exhibit.

- **Artwork title**: as you would like to see it labeled in the exhibit.
- **Medium**: please choose one from the categories that comes up or you may type your own. Please reference the 6 categories of artwork above.
- Market Price: this is the sales price for your piece, or you may mark it as NFS (not for sale). (Ignore "wholesale price.")
- Image: to enter your work in this show you will need to either drag in or "choose files," for your artwork image (jpg. or jpeg.) Please make sure your image is clear and only shows your artwork (no glare, frames, furniture, etc.)
- **Dimensions**: in inches ("D" is for sculpture, 3-dimensional work).

After completing the above information, please click "Submit Piece" at the bottom. You will get a box that asks, if you are sure, and if so, please click "OK".

After submitting your entry, a screen will show recent uploads and then prompt you to "add new work." If you would like to submit a second piece, please do so using the same process. If all pieces (and you're allowed up to 2 works for this virtual exhibit) have been submitted, then choose "sign out."

*If you will enter 2 pieces, then submitting both at the same time is not required. You may go in later using your link and password to submit your second piece. The screen will show the work that you have already submitted.

A reminder: members in good standing have been emailed their submission links. If you paid your dues for the Sept. 1, 2020 – Aug. 31, 2021, you are a member in good standing. *If you are unsure of your membership status, please ask. If you have not received the link, please contact Patrick Sieg. Please use it to enter your work in the show. Be sure to type in all information carefully and clearly. This information will be used to contact you and to create the virtual show.

Deadline for all entries is Monday, April 19. If your work is accepted into this show, you will be notified by May 3.

1st Place: *On Display* by Patrick Sieg
This piece is reminiscent of times not so long
ago when we were able to visit Glenview
Mansion Art Gallery. The use of color, with the
mostly muted shades that lead your eye to the
vibrant wardrobe of one visitor elevates this
work by taking you beyond the theme of a
crowd in a gallery and fills you with questions.
The overall composition, sense of movement in
the work and the subject made this painting
stand out.



2nd Place: Art Critic by Barbara Bell This work is similar in subject matter to the previous work but is done with a different approach. It is beautifully executed. The focus and gesture of the central character and the color and layering of the paint make this piece whimsical and successful.



3rd Place: *Vibrant Glenview Mansion* by Joanne Liotta Aarons
The loose watercolor and ink work is an expressive, vibrant interpretation. The layering of colors freely applied reminded me of flickering shadows and the tight composition

forced me to focus on the grounds and building with a fresh perspective. It is joyful and hopeful.

Twenty-one of **Howard Clark**'s most successful images are currently on exhibit at the Brookside Gardens Visitor Center in Wheaton, MD. The images range in size from 11"X14" to 24"X36." They are grouped into three sets – (1) Cherry Blossoms, (2) Animals and Flowers, (3) Landscapes and Scenics. While most are matted and framed, several are presented on glossy aluminum. An additional dozen or so images are available as 16"X20" loose prints in the Gift Shop's Bin Box. The show will continue through March 27. The Visitor Center is open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. daily.

Howard's image of a "Baby Osprey" has been selected for inclusion in a group show called "Birds of a Feather" at the Arts Barn in Gaithersburg. That walk-in show opens on Friday, March 26, and continues until Sunday, May 2.





Michael Kuchinsky has two pieces in the 2021 Cumberland Valley Photographers Exhibition on display Jan. 31- April 4, 2021.










