Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Dear Rockville Art League artists,

Creating art, regardless of your medium, is never easy and sometimes you simply have to "go for it."

Even getting started can be a challenge. You can never know if your work will turn out. Even the most confident artist will wonder if their work will be appreciated and meet expectations, especially their own expectations.

And if you enter art in a juried show, will it make the cut?
Several things are true...

- Deep down inside one believes that they have something to offer, or they wouldn't consider themselves an artist.
- Every artist's vision and work are different, unique. In a juried show the judge decides which pieces to include in an exhibit and which should be awarded a prize. They cannot judge the worthiness of an artist.
- Artists that don't "go for it" are missing a chance to share their vision and make a difference.

 And sometimes work not included in one show can be award winning in other shows.
 We rely on our judges to make selections based on their talent, observations and experience. The judges we select are accomplished and make great efforts to consider every piece. But their choices represent one person's opinion.
 I have purchased art after it was juried out of a show, art that I love and enjoy every day.

The Rockville Art League's juried shows are beautiful, and I believe being included in these exhibits is an honor.

Entering juried shows is risky. But "going for it" gives the artist an opportunity to make a difference and exhibiting their creations with the best work of other members who have also taken the risk.

The only artist that has not ever been juried out of a show is the artist that never entered a juried show.



Another example of "going for it" was RAL's adjustment to the pandemic. When Covid struck, we faced the reality of no in person meetings, or exhibits or networking. We had to adjust, and we needed to embrace the virtual. We problem-solved, embraced technology, and made it work.

Thursday, November 4, on Zoom: Dr. Lorena Bradford from the National Gallery of Art on "The Art of Looking"

We are excited to welcome back Dr. Lorena Bradford of the National Gallery of Art. Some of you may remember that she juried our Winter Juried Members Show in December 2017. This time she will guide us as we focus on a single work of art together and facilitate a conversation to help us engage fully with the artwork and the world around us, helping us to hone visual

literacy skills and offering perspective. This is for all types of artists and art appreciators.



Lorena Bradford develops and runs accessible programs in the Education Division of the National Gallery of Art in Washington, DC. She also focuses on creating programs for the general public that center slow, mindful looking to foster a shared experience in which participants learn from listening to each other's perspectives. Lorena has consulted and offered training on best practices for other museums and institutions in Washington, DC, across the nation, and abroad, and has both Masters and doctoral degrees in art history from the University of Delaware.

RAL Juried Members' Winter Show

Call for entries: <u>deadline</u> Friday, October 29 **Judge**: We are honored that renowned artist Christine Lashley will judge our Rockville Art League Juried Members' Winter Show.

This show will be on display in person at Glenview Mansion (603 Edmonston Dr.) with the virtual show available on our website. Christine Lashley will announce the award-winning pieces on Thursday, December 9 at 7:00pm on Zoom. (A link will be sent out a few days prior.)

Call Deadline: Members in good standing may submit up to 2 pieces of work to be juried for this show beginning the first week of October through Friday, October 29 with the entry link emailed to you. No submissions will be accepted after the October 29 deadline. Acceptances will be emailed out to all members and posted on RAL website by November 12. Please check our website and read all the information below carefully about how to enter.

Eligibility and rules: The following rules apply for all works entered. Each member in good standing may enter up to two pieces of original work not exhibited in a previous RAL Juried Members Show.

- IMPORTANT: the submission form (with your personal link and password) has been *emailed out* to members *in good standing*. Please mark or save your personal link and use it when you are ready to submit your work. If you haven't received the email with the link, please send a note to president@rockvilleartleague.org.
- Please save the link and these instructions and use it to submit your work (up to 2 pieces) in this juried show.
- When you click the link sent to you, you will be prompted for your password.
 Please type it in exactly. It is case sensitive. No extra spaces.

Instructions:

When you submit your work to be juried, please complete the following fields. Other fields are optional and will not be used in the exhibit.

- **Artwork title**: as you would like to see it labeled in the exhibit.
- Medium: please choose one from the categories that comes up or you may type your own.
- Market Price: this is the sales price for your piece, or if the piece is not for sale, please leave this blank and you may mark it as *Not for Sale* in the *Status* box. (Ignore "wholesale price")
- Image: to enter your work in this show you will need to either drag in or "choose files," for your artwork image (jpg. or jpeg.) Please make sure your image is clear and only shows your artwork (no glare, frames, furniture, etc.)
- **Dimensions**: in inches (height and width for 2-dimensional work; depth is for sculpture, 3-dimensional work)

After completing the above information, please click "Submit Piece" at the bottom. You will get a box that asks, if you are sure, and if so, please click "OK".

After submitting your entry, a screen will show recent uploads and then prompt you to "add new work." If you would like to submit a second piece, please do so using the same process.

If all pieces (up to 2) have been submitted, then choose "sign out.

If your work is accepted into this show:

- Show Fee: A \$10 show fee will be collected from *accepted* artists (not per piece) prior to delivery of artwork.
- Each piece must be ready for hanging, gallery-wrapped or framed or professionally finished, securely wired.
- Only original works <u>framed securely</u> with hanging wire are acceptable. (No

- sawtooth hangers or such.) If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished. No wet canvases are allowed.
- The maximum measurement of any framed side is **48 inches**.
- The entries may not have been exhibited previously in a RAL Juried Members Show. All artists are encouraged to sign their work on either the front or back.
- Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted.
- RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show.
- All work must remain up until the end of the show.
- Sales: As this will be an in-person show, if any work sells while on display at Glenview, the artist agrees to donate 20% of the sales price to the City of Rockville.
- The Show Agreement: Artists showing work at Glenview must agree to the following:

"I agree to the rules of the show as presented in the show call and the schedule below, that my entries are my original works and have not been accepted into a previous Rockville Art League Juried Members' Show, and I will not hold the Rockville Art League, Glenview Mansion or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries. As with any show, I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in the handling of my artwork. I give RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to use images of my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during a

physical show at Glenview to the City of Rockville."

Categories of Artwork Include:

- Oils and acrylics
- Watercolors
- Pastels, drawings, and hand-pulled prints
- Mixed media, collage, experimental, and original computer-generated art
- Photographs
- Sculpture and ceramics

Awards:

- Best in Show (cash prize)
- First, Second, Third in all categories (cash prizes)
- Honorable Mention at Judge's Discretion

Schedule:

- By October 7 online submission link emailed to members *in good standing*
- October 29 deadline for all submissions
- November 12 acceptances sent out to all members and posted on website
- November 29 delivery of accepted artwork at Glenview, 10:00am-1:00pm
- **December 5,** 1:30-3:30pm, *Meet the Artists* Opening at Glenview Mansion (optional)
- December 9, 7pm on Zoom Christine Lashley will discuss her choices of the award-winning pieces. A zoom link will be sent out to members a few days in advance. It will be recorded.
- **January 18: pick up artwork** 10:00am-1:00pm

A reminder and summary:

Register your work with the link that was emailed to you the first week of October. Submissions of up to 2 pieces per artist for consideration by the judge will be accepted by **Friday, October 29**.

Members in good standing will be emailed the submission link by October 7. If you paid your dues for Sept. 1, 2021 – Aug. 31, 2022, you are a member in good standing. PLEASE: if you are unsure of your membership status, please ask us! If you do not receive the link by October 7, contact president. Please use it to enter your work in the show. Be sure to type in all information carefully and clearly. This information will be used to contact you and to create the virtual show.

Deadline for all entries is Friday, October 29.

Acceptances will be mailed out to all members by November 12.

RAL Juried Members' Winter Show Judge

We are honored to have renowned artist Christine Lashley jury our Winter Show. Please read about Christine Lashley below: As a contemporary impressionist painter and lifelong nature enthusiast, Christine Lashley gathers most of her ideas by painting outdoors. The art she creates on location or in the studio is about the beauty of a moment held in memory. Her paintings often fuse reality and the abstract, using color and texture to look realistic from afar but dissolve into abstraction up-close. Christine has been involved in the arts all her life, with early years sketching outdoors and watching her mother and grandmother create sculpture. She spent several years in the high fashion world of Europe, and then worked in graphic design and creating murals. She began painting professionally with watercolors but

moved to oils in 2009. Her work has won numerous awards, including Best of Show for both landscape and portrait work. Recent awards were the ARC Salon (Plein Air), Bold Brush Award (June 2020), Best Landscape at the 27th Oil Painters of America National Show, and Best of Show at Telluride Plein Air and Bath County Plein Air. Christine's work has been featured in many articles, publications, and media, including two art-instruction DVDs released by Liliedahl, and the cover of *Plein Air Magazine*.




With a BFA from Washington University in St. Louis and prior study at the Sorbonne and Parsons in Paris; Christine continued her art education with workshops from prominent artists including Scott Christensen, with whom she is currently doing an online Beyond the Easel Webinar project (a series of interactive artistic conversations).



One of Nancy's pieces, "Please Touch" was featured in the Strathmore's promotional materials for the exhibit. The other piece is of a bristlecone pine, entitled "Entwined." The exhibit runs through October 30th at the Mansion at Strathmore.





Sally Davies time-lapse film "Pandemic Romance" was a finalist in the Vancouver Independent Film Festival, and also was an award winner in the Toronto Independent Film Festival of Cift, and it is a nominee for Best Micro Short at the San Francisco Indie Shorts

Festival. Sally's time-lapse "Labyrinth of Life" was a finalist in the National Short Film Festival which will be screened at the Film Festival in March 2022. Her 4 minute and 40 second film is difficult to place in one category; "Labyrinth of Life" is a short, experimental, animated, documentary, time-lapse, protest, art film.

Paula Zeller's oil painting "The Hard Work" was awarded Second Place in the Strathmore Foundation's 30th Annual Juried Exhibition: TOUCH. Four more of Paula's paintings also are in the show, which runs through October 30 at the Mansion at Strathmore, Wednesday-Saturday, 12-4 p.m.
