Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Dear Rockville Art League Artists,

The newest exhibit at the Glenview Mansion Art Gallery, "Lost, Found and Looking Forward," is a beautiful show. This show is in collaboration with the City of Rockville and many thanks to Betty Wisda, Arts Programs Supervisor with Rockville, for her support of this show.

Please make time to see it and bring your friends, you will be glad you did. The art gallery is freshly painted, and the renewed walls complement the fantastic artwork.

Lisa and I attended the Rockville Concert Band concert that was a tie in with this show. We were able to display eight paintings from our exhibit (the prize winners) in the lobby of the Fitzgerald Theatre and we heard many positive comments from concert attendees. It was gratifying to be out and about again even if things are moving forward cautiously. Many masks were thankfully being worn and there was only limited seating (about half the theater's capacity) and there was a tangible sense that we were headed back to normal. Musicians and visual artists have a lot in common...accomplished after devoting much time and effort to our craft. We, individual artists, shine brighter in a group setting, like a concert band or in our league's case, a group exhibition.

Many thanks to the artists that contributed their art to this show and your response was so encouraging and inspiring. The gallery is filled with heartfelt impressions, both good and not so good of the last two, pandemic years.

And as we gain positive ground towards recovering from COVID restrictions the world is shaken by new horrors. Sunflowers are the national flower of Ukraine, and I was motivated to paint them in a new composition. I am certainly not alone in attempting such creations. In addition to being beautiful, artistic renditions of sunflowers remind us of warm days and much light. With the war raging, sunflowers can also remind us of the proud Ukrainian people and their struggle.

Later in this newsletter please note the fund raiser being sponsored by Dr. Irina Stotland to support the victims of the war in Ukraine. Dr. Stotland has presented to our group for the last five years in our September RAL meetings. I plan to contribute to one of the fully vetted charities she lists and look forward to the art talk she is offering as a thank you. I hope you will all consider contributing as well.

Our call for entry is up and running for our 2022 Juried Members Spring Show. Details are later in the newsletter, and I am looking forward to many submissions of beautiful art. Please keep the submission deadline in mind as I would hate for you to miss it.

I hope many of you were able to view Ben Carter's talk with our league. I am happy to now know more about pottery and ceramics and what an important artistic medium it is...now and throughout history.

Our next speaker will be west coast artist Sharon Carol Demery and she will share how she moves her art from Impressionism to Fauvism. I know this will be a colorful conversation.

Our league relies on the generosity of our members and the support of member volunteers. Sarah Sohraby and Richard Fisher are new board members and they have taken the lead on securing speakers for our group.

Jennifer Lubell and David Allen helped Lisa hang the "Lost Found and Looking Forward" exhibit and Sarah Sohraby with the show's art delivery.

Sharon Carol Demery "Impressionism into Fauvism"



"Claude Monet, Mary Cassatt, Henri Matisse. These great masters took painting to fascinating new levels. I will talk about these groundbreaking artists and their painting styles. The demo will show the impressionist techniques of painting and move on to the Fauve techniques style of painting. Bright colors and simplified compositions, loose style of painting with strong brushwork, keeping images simple and without details. Take notes or paint along with me!" ~Sharon Carol Demery



Sharon Carol Demery moved from the San Francisco Bay area to Los Angeles where she studied, painted, and began her career. There she developed her modern art with an affinity for vibrant color, purity and simplicity depicting images of abstraction that retain their cohesiveness. She was associated with the 1970's Abstract Illusionism movement. Primarily considered an abstract painter, her artistic facility and mixed-genre style elude classification as she works in both abstraction and representational painting. She has shown her work in galleries and museums around the country and is also in many private and public collections. As an award-winning artist, it has been reviewed in numerous publications, including Art Magazine, and The New York Review.



Sharon taught painting at Arizona Western College in Yuma, AZ, from 1979 to 1981 after which she moved to San Diego where she attended UCSD and received the Professional Certificate in Art and the Creative Process. She attended Platt College and received a diploma in Graphic Design. She also studied human development at San Diego City College. For the past ten years she has been teaching at the Athenaeum Music & Arts Library in their School of the Arts program. She has been influenced by her many travels on three continents and by the great works of masters like Van Gogh, Cezanne, Monet, Matisse, Bonnard, Kandinsky, O'Keefe, Krasner, Joan Mitchell, Thiebaud, and Diebenkorn. "Painting for me is about discovery, growth, and human emotions. My goal is to continue studying the masters old and new to continue my journey in painting."

MAY 15 – JUNE 24, 2022 Glenview Mansion

Call for entries: <u>MARCH 5 - APRIL 8</u>. Online registrations only.

Judge: We are honored that art historian Dr. Irina Stotland will judge our *Rockville Art League Juried Members' Spring Show*. Members will remember her in-depth and fascinating presentations on a variety of famous artists from Bosch to Velasquez, Toulouse-Lautrec to Gauguin, and Mary Cassatt. Dr. Stotland received her doctorate in the History of Art from Bryn Mawr College, Bryn Mawr, PA. A specialist in nineteenth-century French art, her research interests include postimpressionist self-portraiture, with special emphasis on the construction of identity in representations. Her article on Paul Gauguin's self-portraits appears in "Gauguin's Challenge. New Perspectives After Postmodernism." (ed. Norma Broude, 2018). She is currently teaching at Montgomery College LLI, Rockville MD, and lecturing at various museums and educational organizations. This juried show will be on display in person at Glenview Mansion with the virtual show available on our website. Irina Stotland will discuss the award-winning pieces on Thursday, May 19 at 7:00pm on Zoom.

Call Deadline: Members in good standing may submit up to 2 pieces of work for this show beginning MARCH 5 until APRIL 8 to be considered by the judge. No submissions will be accepted after the <u>April 8 deadline</u>. If your work is accepted into this show, you will be informed <u>by April 22</u>. Please read all the information below carefully.

Entry Fee: A \$10 show fee will be collected from *accepted* artists (not per piece).

Eligibility and rules: The following rules apply for all works entered.

- Each member in good standing may enter up to two pieces **during the specified dates**.
- How to enter: register your work beginning MARCH 5 using your personal link that was emailed to you to submit your work into the past 2 shows. Submissions of up to 2 pieces per artist for consideration by the judge will be accepted by Friday, April 8.
- For each submission you will be required to include the title, medium, dimensions and market price (if not for sale, please leave blank) and to **submit an image** (jpeg or jpg.) of your piece. The mat or the frame (or glass, glare, wall, etc.) should NOT be visible in the image you submit. Just the artwork itself.

• If your work is accepted into this show, you will be required to **agree** to the terms of the show agreement below as well as pay the show fee.

Requirements: If your work is accepted into this show, *each 2-D piece must be ready for hanging*, gallery-wrapped or framed or professionally finished, securely wired.

- The maximum measurement of any framed side is **48 inches**.
- Only original works <u>framed securely with</u> <u>hanging wire</u> are acceptable. (No sawtooth hangers or such.) If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished. <u>No</u> <u>wet canvases</u> are allowed.
- The <u>entries may not have been exhibited</u> previously in a RAL Juried Members Show. All artists are encouraged to sign their work on either the front or back.
- Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted.
- RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show.
- All work must remain up until the end of the show.
- **Sales:** If any work sells while on display at Glenview, the artist agrees to donate 20% of the sales price to the City of Rockville.
- <u>The Show Agreement</u>: artists showing work at Glenview must agree to the following:

"I agree to the rules of the show as presented in the show call and the schedule below, that my entries are my original works and have not been accepted into a previous Rockville Art League Juried Members' Show, and I will not hold the Rockville Art League, Glenview Mansion or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries. As with any show, I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in the handling of my artwork. I give RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to use images of my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during this show at Glenview to the City of Rockville."



PLEASE: if you are unsure of your membership status, ask us! If you cannot find your link, please ask. Use it to enter your work in the show. Be sure to type in all information carefully and clearly. This information will be used to contact you and to create the virtual show and the labels.

You may enter work for this show beginning on MARCH 5. Deadline for all entries is Friday, April 8.

If your work is accepted into this show, you will be notified **by April 22.**

LOST, FOUND AND LOOKING FORWARD MARCH 20 – MAY 6

The City of Rockville and the Rockville Art League are proud to present an art exhibit to complement the premiere performance by the Rockville Concert Band at the F. Scott Fitzgerald Theatre on March 13 of an original commissioned concert piece created by worldrenowned composer Johan de Meij to honor those lost to COVID and offer a breath of hope as we head to the future.

The theme of this art exhibit, "Lost, Found, and Looking Forward," is the pandemic and the hope for the aftermath. The pieces in this show capture an element of the unique times of March 2020 until now, and as we look ahead: what we *Lost*, what we *Found* and our hope as we are *Looking Forward*.

Please join us on Sunday, March 20, 1:30-3:30pm at Glenview Mansion to Meet the Artists at the Opening. Prize winners will be recognized at 1:45pm.

We are honored to have Therese Capal assign prizes of recognition and we thank her for all her work on this show. Her remarks about this noteworthy show follow.

I am honored to judge the submissions to Rockville Art League's latest show, which is a look back at our experiences over the past two years and our hopes for what comes next as we wait for a return to life as we remember it. This period of time has inspired a wide range of emotions: fear, loneliness, sickness, frustration, hope. The inspiring works submitted express a unique artistic view of the thoughts and processes found inside us all during this unusual time.

As I viewed all the entries, I was not surprised to see that the subject matter was as widely varied as the range of emotions felt by so many of us. There were so many beautifully executed pieces that narrowing down the selections has been extremely difficult. I tried to choose pieces that were skillfully rendered yet went beyond by suggesting inner thoughts and ideas.

1st Place: *Solace* by Karen Lantner A deceivingly simple image. Skillfully painted folds of cloth with shadows and elegantly rendered tassels laying over an open book. A simple outstanding still life at first glance. More is added to this picture at closer look. The colors and tassels reveal a prayer shawl. The book could be a bible, or other words of inspiration. This image evokes powerful emotion. Not only is it a beautiful painting, it also offers the message that so many of us turned to our faith to offer strength and guidance.



2nd Place: *Fam* by Cynthia Rivarde This grouping painted with confident loose strokes speaks to the small circle of immediate family many of us have been living with during the height of the pandemic. The love and appreciation of our small groups shines through in the eyes of these three people and the slight smile of the young woman on the left. We have held our loved ones close during this time. The three apparently peaceful figures hold hidden depths.



3rd Place: *Remembrance* by Barbara Bell A beautiful watercolor which at first glance could be read as simply a lovely floral painting. However, there is so much more to this work. Vibrant tones in the background create a base for a branch with flowers and leaves that have lost much of their color in the center foreground. This center branch appears to be fading away, dying. The image brings sadness and reminds us of time, memories and friends or family we have lost.

submissions once again renew my admiration for the talent found here in Rockville. Thank you to Rockville Art League for allowing me to present my choices.




