Sunflowers July 5 – September 2, 2022 Glenview Mansion

Rockville Art League *members in good standing* are invited to submit original works of *up to three (3) pieces of art for consideration* for the show *Sunflowers* to be exhibited at the Glenview Mansion Art Gallery. This show is sponsored by the City of Rockville Arts Division and the Rockville Art League.

The theme of this exhibit is *Sunflowers*. These bold, brilliant flowers literally look on the bright side as they follow the sun throughout the day. In Victorian *floriography* they signified gratitude, and they have been portrayed throughout the centuries so beautifully by so many artists. They also represent community and our interdependence with one another and nature. As the national flower of Ukraine, it has become a symbol of solidarity and hope for peace.

We are looking for your artistic portrayals/renditions/interpretations of this optimistic flower.

Deadline: Monday, May 23

Each member may submit up to three (3) pieces for consideration by Monday, May 23.

The work may be newly created but you may also submit a piece you have created earlier* in the following mediums: (*It also may have been exhibited in a prior show).

- oils/acrylics
- watercolors
- drawings, pastels, hand-pulled prints

- mixed media, collage, experimental
- photography
- sculpture

All 2-D pieces will need to be framed, gallery-wrapped or professionally finished, securely wired, ready for hanging with the *maximum* measurement of any framed side of 48 inches. If submitting unframed work, the edges should be painted or finished. No wet paint. Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted. RAL retains the right to determine the suitability of the work for entry in this show.

To submit work, please use your same personal link and password that was sent to you to enter your work for the RAL Juried Members' Winter Show, the Lost, Found, Looking Forward Show, and the Juried Members' Spring Show.

When you submit work, you will need to complete the following for each of your pieces (*up to 3 entries only*): 1.) **title**, 2.) **medium**, 3.) **market value/price** (*not wholesale*) (if NFS, please leave blank and we will confirm with you), 4.) a clear **image** (jpg.) of your artwork, and 5.) **dimensions** (height and width only for 2-D art; height, width and depth is for 3-D).

Note: When you submit work, *if you entered artwork in the past two RAL Shows this year*, you will still see the images of those pieces. They are marked appropriately for the show they are in within the system.

Show agreement after the notifications are sent out by June 3, you will need to agree to the following before your work can be exhibited: "I agree to the exhibition dates as listed below, that my entries are my original works, and I will not hold the Rockville Art League (RAL), Glenview Mansion, or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries while on the Rockville Civic Center Park property. I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in handling my entries. I give

RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to photograph my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during this show at Glenview to the City of Rockville."

Schedule:

MONDAY, May 23: <u>deadline for all</u> submissions.

FRIDAY, June 3: notifications sent out and posted on RAL website.

MONDAY, June 27: drop off artwork, Glenview Mansion, 10:00am-1:00pm.

Sunday, July 31: "Meet the Artists" opening at Glenview. 1:30-3:30pm (optional)

TUESDAY, September 6: pick up of artwork 10:00am-1:00pm.


This show will be exhibited in person at Glenview Mansion. Additionally, the virtual show will be available to view on the Rockville Art League website and sent to all members to share.


LOST, FOUND AND LOOKING FORWARD MARCH 20 – MAY 6

Making Your Best Work

Entering a show or posting your work online can be daunting. You might ask yourself: Is it finished? Is it good enough? Is it the best I can do at this point in my artistic development?

One way to evaluate your own work is to borrow criteria jurors use when selecting art for a show. The Oil Painters of America (OPA) is a nonprofit organization that promotes excellence in representational art. When jurying art, OPA scores pieces using a set of questions, as described in a blog by the late James Bruce Jr., Master Signature OPA member. I find the following questions the most helpful:

- Is there a clear center of interest?
- Is there balance?
- Do the shapes and lines lead the eyes to focal points within the picture plane?
- Is the drawing accurate?
- Are the value relationships convincing?
- Are the color temperature relationships consistent and believable?
- Is there an appropriate variety of hard and soft edges?
- Does the painting's intent or execution demonstrate a unique, compelling, or worthwhile idea?

Though I pose these questions to myself, I can't always look at my work objectively enough. Fortunately, I can discuss these criteria with my critique group, whom I can always count on to see my paintings with fresh eyes.






