- Our September speaker will be art historian Dr. Irina Stotland. We are so lucky to have her back again this year continuing our tradition of having her kick-off our art league's year. Her Zoom will be on Thursday, September 8, and her topic will be the Abstract Impressionists. I can't wait to hear more about this ground-breaking group of early 20th century artists and to learn about how they changed art, culture and many argue, the world.
- In October we will hear from North Carolina based artist Tony Alderman. His topic will be how his art helps highlight the disappearing costal community in the eastern part of that state.
- In November we will host the art educator and Glen Echo Resident Artist, Jordan Bruns. Many members know Jordan, have taken his classes and he will talk about his three year long experience in Japan and how it has influenced his art practice.

We will continue to host in-person "meet the artists" events related to RAL exhibits this upcoming year. These events have been well attended this year and all attendees are careful, considerate, and glad for the opportunity to see their friends and beautiful artwork.

Amazingly, fall is upon us. It is not too early to begin thinking about our winter juried show. More details will be in the October newsletter. Clearly, we have much going on this fall and your support makes it all possible.

2022 Fall Speaker Series:

Our Meetings/Presentations are normally on the first Thursday of the month. This fall they will be on zoom with the invitation sent to members a few days prior.

September 8: Art Historian Dr. Irina Stotland, on *Abstract Expressionism*, 7pm on zoom



We are pleased to welcome back Dr. Irina Stotland to kick off our speaker series. Members will remember her in-depth and fascinating presentations on a variety of famous artists from Bosch to Velasquez, Toulouse-Lautrec to Gauguin, and Mary Cassatt. She also juried our 2022 Juried Members' Spring Show. This time she will discuss the most important

American art movement of the 20th century, *Abstract Expressionism*. Emerging in the aftermath of WWII and the atomic bomb, the liberated explorations of color on a monumental scale, the Abstract Expressionists turned New York into the new capital of the western art world. Though diverse in style, these abstract artists shared a common rejection of traditional representation in favor of gesture and color as expressive of inner emotions.



Dr. Stotland received her doctorate in the History of Art from Bryn Mawr College, Bryn Mawr, PA. A specialist in nineteenth-century French art, her research interests include post-impressionist self-portraiture, with special emphasis on the construction of identity in representations. Her article on Paul Gauguin's self-portraits appears in "Gauguin's Challenge. New Perspectives After Postmodernism." (ed. Norma Broude, 2018). She is currently teaching at Montgomery College LLI, Rockville MD, and lecturing at various museums and educational organizations.

We plan to record this presentation and will send it out to members to watch within 30 days.



They also represent community and our interdependence with one another and nature. As the national flower of Ukraine, it has become a symbol of solidarity and hope for peace. The artists in this show offer their unique interpretation of this optimistic flower in its varied stages.





There are 120 works in a variety of mediums in this dazzling show by local artists on display at the Glenview Mansion Art Gallery (603 Edmonston Drive at the Rockville Civic Center Park). We thank Steve Loya who awarded prizes of recognition and congratulate the award winners: first prize to Patrick Sieg for "Sunflowers Stand for Freedom," second prize to Sandy Yagel for "Teapot and Sunflowers," third prize to Sheila Hadley for "Put Them in Your Pockets." Honorable Mention to: Cecelia M. Laurendeau for "Luminance," Lisa Sieg for "Mirror, Mirror," and Holly Buehler for "At Rest."

Several artists in the show will donate the net proceeds of the sale of their specified artwork to a vetted humanitarian charity for Ukraine as noted on their labels at Glenview and on the virtual show.

The RAL Sunflowers Show is on display through Sept. 1 as the gallery is closed on Friday, Sept. 2 for a private event. Also, closed on Labor Day Monday, Sept. 5.



MAA Paint the Town Art Show

This year famed DC contemporary artist Lenny Campello will serve as the judge of the show and will evaluate more than 500 works in seven categories at the Montgomery Art Association's annual Paint the Town Labor Day Show at the Historic Armory in Kensington, Maryland. He also will judge the one-day Kensington plein air painting competition and will present prizes at the September 3 reception.

The annual art show runs for three days—September 3-5—and features hundreds of pieces of artwork by member artists. Original paintings, drawings, sculptures, and photography—plus prints and notecards—will all be for sale. A portion of proceeds goes in support of MAA's educational mission.
