Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Dear Rockville Art League artists,

Our Rockville Art League Juried Members' Winter Show has just ended.

We had a strong turnout at our opening "Meet the Artists" event +-180 visitors. It was great to see so many happy and proud members.

During the event I overheard one person sharing that our Best-In-Show piece was "simply awesome."

What a compliment. And that could be said of many of the artworks in our exhibit.

I decided to do a bit of research on the word "awe."

Awe is defined as an overwhelming feeling of reverence, admiration, (sometimes fear), etc., produced by that which is grand, sublime, extremely powerful, or the like.

"Awe is the feeling of being in the presence of something vast that transcends your understanding of the world," said Dacher Keltner, a psychologist at the University of California, Berkeley. But awe is also simpler than we think — and accessible to everyone, he writes in his book "Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life."

Awe often comes from novelty. So, gravitating toward the unexpected can set us up to instill and experience awe. As artists, we have the power and creativity to instill awe if our viewers and collectors are open to being awed. If they pay attention and focus and are mindful of the effort that went into the artist's creation, then awe will follow.

And that feeling of awe will benefit the lives of both the viewer and the artist. I hope you will take every opportunity to view art, create art and experience the awe that can be all around us.

Each time a show departs I am grateful for the gift of seeing/experiencing art and, at the same time, I am very much looking forward to the next exhibit and appreciate the new joy it will bring.

And we will be hosting our next show, Heart of Winter, in conjunction with the Rockville Student Juried Show from January 22 through February 17, 2023. Please plan to see it and bring your friends and family.



Thursday, Feb. 2, 7pm on Zoom: Glen Kessler *Efficient Portrait Painting: How to Paint a Portrait Quickly and Accurately*

Please join us as Glen Kessler demonstrates a method for getting a quick yet accurate portrait painting. Using easy-to-learn methods that can be honed over time, Glen will take viewers through the entire painting process in just 90 minutes.



Glen Kessler is an internationally collected and awarded artist as well as the founder of The Compass Atelier in Rockville, MD. Kessler has an MFA from New York Academy of Art and a BFA from the Maryland Institute College of Art. His works have graced the cover of 'Professional Artists' Magazine', and been included in 'The Artists' Magazine', among other publications. He has work in the public collections of King Charles III, Amazon Web Services, Ford's Theater, Capital One Bank, Dominion Bank, as well as hundreds of private collections around the world. He is a 2-time recipient of the Elizabeth Greenshields Grant for Outstanding Figurative Art, a Prince of Wales Fellow, and a Maryland State Arts Council Grant awardee. He is also a life-long teacher, having taught at Maryland Institute College of Art, George Washington University, George Mason University, and others. In 2013 he founded The Compass Atelier in Rockville MD, to teach a cohesive curriculum of artistic study of his own design.



The school and its unique curriculum are proving to be a game changer, taking students, many of whom had little to no prior experience, to a professional practice in just three years of part-time study. The Rockville Art League *Heart of Winter* Show


On exhibit: January 22- February 17
