Message from the President, Patrick Sieg

Dear Rockville Art League Artists,

"I had always planned to make a large painting of the early spring when the first leaves are at the bottom of the trees, and they seem to float in space in a wonderful way. But the arrival of spring cannot be done in one picture." David Hockney

I am looking forward to our RAL Juried Member's Spring Show.

Please see the show call in this newsletter and on the RAL website for details and requirements for our spring juried show.

Our deadline for entering is coming up and we hope to see your entries on or before April 11. Several of you have already entered and thank you.

I expect that the work accepted in this juried show will be strong and the exhibit will be beautiful.

I anticipate that we will receive more entries than the art gallery at Glenview Mansion can accommodate. Our Juror, J. Jordan Bruns has the difficult job of deciding which pieces will be in the show and then, which accepted pieces deserve prize recognition.

As is our process, Jordan will see images of the work with titles of the work, the size and the medium. However, he will not see the artist name or the sales price of the entries.

All artists take great pride in their work, I know I do, and most members submit their best work for consideration in our juried shows. You should have confidence in your artwork, and I thank you for be willing to share.

And it is disappointing (or even painful) if your work is not accepted.

A much-shared thought..." The only artist who has not been juried out of a show is the artist who has never entered a juried show."

Acclaimed local poet and former Maryland poet laureate, the late Linda Pastan had interesting things to say about rejection... "All poets get rejected, even the most famous and honored. I tell young poets one trick I've learned. For each group of poems you send out, have an envelope ready on your desk to resubmit those poems. Then, when they come back, don't leave them

sitting around on your desk; send them right back out into the world."

I believe that is great advice for everyone, poets and artists as well.

Many thanks for the presentation on Fauvism by art historian Erich Keel.

Matisse and Derain were the primary artists leading this colorful but short-lived movement.

In slides Erich shared, I much appreciated the artwork by Derain even a bit more than those by Matisse.

Yet Matisse is the artist that is most remembered.

Derain was onto something new and different but, as Erich shared, later in Derain's career, he was consumed by doubts and went back to the traditional style of art. I imagine that the collectors of his time were not willing to support new perspectives and change is always hard.

Mr. Derain probably needed to earn a living and produce the most marketable artwork. I understand that but history often rewards the confident, different, and bold. Matisse is celebrated and remembered (as he should be), while poor Derain is quite obscure. I imagine there is a lesson there.

Please make time to visit the Art Gallery at Glenview Mansion. Lisa Sieg puts much thought and creativity into arranging the work on display and a new and different show is staged every six weeks or so. And The City if Rockville is committed to keeping art on display at the mansion.


- Work by the Washington Water Color Association is on display currently.

Speaker Series:

March 2: Erich Keel on The Path to Fauvism: Matisse and Derain in the South of France



We were delighted to have Erich Keel present "a small corner of 20th century art" as he transported us to Collioure, a small fishing village on the Mediterranean coast, near the Spanish border, where Henri Matisse and Andre Derain spent the summer of 1905 and fully realized the idea of painting with pure color. He traced the path of these two highly gifted artists to Fauvism, which was a new way of painting landscapes, portraits, and literary subjects. Thank you to everyone who joined us and a BIG THANK YOU to Erich Keel for such a fascinating presentation.

April 6: Howard Clark on *Getting from Good to Great*

Please join us **Thursday, April 6, at 7pm on Zoom** as we welcome RAL member, professional photographer and educator, Howard Clark discuss this important topic that will appeal to all artists.



Howard Clark is a professional photographer with over 55 years of experience with

"enthusiast" and professional level gear. Landscapes and "scenics" account for most of his images, and water appears in about 80% of those. He created the lecture on "Getting from Good to Great" as a means for sharing some of the lessons he learned over those years with other artists and photographers.

This lecture examines the various elements that can make the difference between a good picture and a great one. Of course, these include the standard elements of composition, but he goes way beyond that to consider time of day, atmospheric effects, humor, mystery, point of view, and much more. There is also a review of some things that can kill your picture (e.g., double subjects, action flowing out of the frame, cutting off body parts, "centeritis," etc.).




Howard lives in Montgomery Village and participates in two camera clubs and two art associations. For the first seven years after his retirement in 2011, he and his wife participated in 10 to 12 weekend art shows each year. More recently, he has focused on exhibiting his work in a variety of local galleries in the D.C. area. In fact, since retirement, he has exhibited photos in 35 different galleries. Solo exhibits account for 12 of the 35. Two years ago, Howard began a new career as an Adjunct Professor at Frederick Community College. This lecture provides the basis for one of his four courses.

RAL Juried Members' Spring Show MAY 21- JUNE 23, 2023 Glenview Mansion

Call for entries: Tuesday, April 11. *Online submissions only*.

Judge: We are honored that Glen Echo resident artist and educator J. Jordan Bruns will judge our *Rockville Art League Juried Members*' *Spring Show*. Members will remember his engaging presentation in November about his work and the influence of his sabbatical in Japan.

J. Jordan Bruns is a full-time artist living and working in Maryland and a Glen Echo Park resident artist working in the Chautauqua Tower. He recently returned from a three-year sabbatical in Tokyo, Japan (2018-2021) where much of his current aesthetic influences stem from. In 2004, he received BFAs in Painting and Illustration at Maryland Institute College of Art. He then went on to earn an MFA in Studio Painting at Indiana University in 2007. After grad school, he instructed at and managed the Yellow Barn Studio and Gallery, at Glen Echo Park in Maryland. His love of teaching has led him to branch out and become Director of Art Clinic, a painting and drawing school at Glen Echo Park, Maryland in 2022. His artwork is in the public collections of Novartis Pharmaceuticals and Kaiser Permanente. Solo exhibitions include Long View Gallery (Washington, DC) and The Indiana University Art Museum (Bloomington, Indiana). His numerous group shows include "Transient Geometries" at The Antelope Valley College Art Gallery (Lancaster, California) and "Color

Schooled" (Long View Gallery, Washington, DC). His work has also been exhibited in Scope Miami in 2014, Context Miami in 2017 and 2018 as well as Aqua Miami in 2019 during Art Basel.

On Exhibit: This juried show will be on display in person at Glenview Mansion Art Gallery (603 Edmonston Dr./Rockville) with the virtual show available on our website. J. Jordan Bruns will award prizes on Sunday, May 21, 2:00pm at Glenview. A pre-recorded zoom of him discussing awards choices will be sent out the week afterwards.

Call Deadline: Members in good standing may submit up to two (2) pieces of work to be considered by the judge for inclusion in this show by TUESDAY, April 11. No submissions will be accepted after the deadline. If your work is accepted into this show, you will be informed by Monday, April 24. Please read all the information below carefully.

Entry Fee: A flat \$10 show fee will be collected from artists who have their work accepted into this show (not per piece).

<u>IMPORTANT!</u> By submitting work into this show, you are agreeing to the terms of the **Show Agreement** listed here:

"I agree to the rules of the show as presented in this show call and the schedule below, that my entries are my original works and have not been accepted into a previous Rockville Art League Juried Members' Show. I will not hold the Rockville Art League (RAL), Glenview Mansion, or the City of Rockville responsible for any possible loss or damage to my entries. As with any show, I understand that all reasonable care will be taken in the handling of my artwork. I give RAL, Glenview Mansion, and the City of Rockville permission to use

images of my artwork and publish them as appropriate. I acknowledge a commitment to donate 20% of the sale price of my work, if sold during this show at Glenview to the City of Rockville."

Eligibility and rules: The following rules apply for all works entered.

- Each member in good standing may enter up to two pieces by the deadline.
- How to enter: submit your entries using your PERSONAL LINK and PASSWORD that was emailed to you when you renewed this year. Submissions of up to 2 pieces per artist for consideration by the judge will be accepted by Tuesday, April 11.
- For each submission you will be required to include: the **title**, **medium**, **dimensions** (note: depth is for sculpture only) and *market price* (NOT wholesale price!) (If Not for Sale, please leave blank and you will be contacted to confirm this) and **submit an image** (jpeg or jpg.) of your piece. The mat or the frame (or glass, glare, wall, furniture etc.) should NOT be visible in the image you submit. Just the artwork itself.
- If your work is accepted into this show: a \$10 show fee per artist (not per piece) will be collected at that time.
- RAL retains the right to determine suitability of work for entry in this show.

Artwork requirements: If your work is accepted into this show, *each 2-D piece must be ready for hanging*, gallery-wrapped or framed or professionally finished, **securely wired** by May 16.

- The maximum measurement of any framed side is **48 inches**.
- Only original works <u>framed securely with</u> <u>hanging wire</u> are acceptable. (NO sawtooth hangers or such.) If submitting unframed canvas, edges should be painted or finished.
- NO wet canvases are allowed.
- The <u>entries may not have been exhibited</u> previously in a *RAL Juried Members' Show*.

- All artists are encouraged to sign their work on either the front or back.
- Entries not meeting the show conditions will not be accepted.
- All work must remain up until the end of the show.
- **Sales:** If any work sells while on display at Glenview, the artist agrees to donate 20% of the sales price to the City of Rockville as specified in the *Show Agreement* above.

- Tuesday, April 11 deadline for all submissions online submissions (up to 2 pieces per artist)
- Monday, April 24 notifications of acceptances sent out to all members by this date
- TUESDAY, May 16— delivery of accepted artwork at Glenview, 10:00am-1:00pm; if your work is accepted into this show, you or your designee must deliver your work during this time. The judge will award prizes based on an in-person view.
- Sunday, May 21, 1:30-3:30pm, *Meet the Artists* Opening at Glenview Mansion. J. Jordan Bruns will award prizes at 2:00pm with remarks about the work. He will also be available throughout the afternoon to talk with artists.

- Week of May 22: A pre-recorded zoom video of the judge discussing his awards choices will be sent out to all members.
- Monday, June 26 pick up artwork 10:00am-1:00pm

Please note: Members in good standing have been emailed their personal link. It is the same one you used to enter shows this year. If you paid your dues for Sept. 1, 2022 – Aug. 31, 2023, you are a member in good standing. PLEASE: if you are unsure of your membership status, ask us! If you cannot find your link, please ask. Use your personal link/password to enter your work in the show. Be sure to type in all information carefully and clearly. This information will be used to contact you and to create the virtual show and the labels.

If you need help, **please ask** ahead of the deadline!

You may enter work for this show now through Tuesday, April 11.



Angela Lacy's painting, "Morning City Walk," received the Best in Show at the Art League's annual fundraising Patrons' show. There were more than 600 artworks donated.

Patricia Dubroof, artist, and creative aging specialist is pleased to announce that she is the recipient of a Creativity Grant from the Maryland State Arts Council to further develop her "Who Cares?" series.

"Making art is what gives me pure joy. I begin with a blank canvas and let my heart and paint brush take over. I have so many memories stored away, and I let them surface based on the energy of the day. Making art makes me feel good and it's part of my self-care practice."

"I paint the "Who Cares?" portraits from memory of those caregivers that have left a visual impression in my mind. In the studio, they come back to life as paintings on canvas, paper, or wood. Each is unique and explores the character of the caregiver. Over the three + decades that I have worked in the field of aging and creativity, I have met hundreds of caregivers. I hope this selection of 50 caregivers gives the viewer a connection and memory to think back on."

Caregivers are so important in our society but often get overlooked because they are lower wage earners, their jobs are not glamorous, and they are often recent immigrants to the US. Caregivers in Maryland and elsewhere are a diverse and international group, and it is important to document the experiences, perspectives, and lessons from these diverse individuals.

Throughout this year, Patricia will be conducting interviews with caregivers. These interviews will be recorded, transcribed, and paired with portraits of caregivers from her ongoing painting series, "Who Cares?".

The interviews and artworks will be virtually exhibited, with plans to exhibit and celebrate inperson in the future. 10% of the sale of each "Who Cares?" artwork will be donated to The Arc Montgomery County, a non-profit organization that supports caregivers and their families.



Barbara Bell is in a show opening on March 18 at the Chinese Culture and Community Service Center in Gaithersburg. "Earth, Fire and Water: Forces in Balance" is a collaborative exhibition in which three artists have come together to present their shared appreciation of the natural world and to express the balance, calm and order they discover there.

Watercolorist Barbara Bell's paintings focus on the fluidity and rhythms of the natural world. She invites the viewer to see the fleeting moments often missed by the casual observer instances of regeneration and renewal, balance, and discord. A former lithographer, her paintings reflect her love of line and pattern, balanced by a more impressionistic use of color. 




- 1. Fitzgerald's life or works (possibly the family association with Rockville)
- 2. The 2023 Honoree Jonathan Franzen
- 3. Jonathan Franzen writings and images

- 4 This year's festival theme is, "Mental Illness in Fiction"
- 5. Some meaningful combination of 2 or more of the above

Submissions must be limited in size to 18" x 24" max. and 11" x 17" minimum.

Submission should include: artists name, title, size, material, bio, artist statement about the artwork and its connection to the themes, website, email, phone number and full address. The First-Place winner's original artwork will belong to the FSF Literary Conference, Inc. The festival will have use of the image for reproduction in social media, hard copy material and our website. The artist will maintain rights to reproduce the work.

Submissions must be delivered on or before Friday, June 24, 2023 (location TBD in Rockville.) No return postage/shipping available.

Judging will take place on Saturday, June 25. Work not selected must be picked up after the judging by June 27th.

Where: Exhibition will be held for the winner and finalists at the F. Scott Literary Festival to be held at Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Rockville (UUCR) Saturday, October 21, 2023

Honorarium/Award: \$1000 will be awarded to the winner. 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded \$100 each. The three finalists will be displayed at the event. Each winner will receive a FREE ticket to the festival. (We encourage the artist to be there to respond to attendees' comments and questions.)




Mat Boards Need a New Home


